**SUMMER RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP AT RUHR UNIVERSITY IN BOCHUM, GERMANY**

---

In cooperation with the School of Law, the Ruhr-University in Bochum, Germany, offers research fellowships to Saint Louis University law students and new law faculty. Each fellowship covers a period of up to three months at the Ruhr-University. To take advantage of the fellowship, prospective fellows must:

- Have sufficient command of the German language;
- Complete the application and provide all required documents, including a brief description of their research plan;
- Upon receipt of a completed application, the Center for International and Comparative Law assists applicants in obtaining acceptance of the plan by a professor at the Ruhr-University who will act as advisor to the applicant.

The Fellowships, provided by the Organization for the Promotion of Legal Science in Bochum (*Verein zur Förderung der Rechtswissenschaft e.V., Bochum*), will pay the cost of round-trip travel from Saint Louis to Bochum. In addition, the fellowship includes a stipend of up to approximately U.S. \$800-900 per month to supplement the applicant's income or up to approximately U.S. \$1,100-1,300 for those who have no income.

Students are encouraged to develop their research plan in consultation with a member of the faculty of the School of Law. When a student's research at the Ruhr-University meets the School of Law's requirements for a Directed Research, such research can provide the basis for academic credit that counts toward the student's J.D. degree.
